Go to your Apps or Play store, search for Kuranui College and download the free app. Once installed on your device, School Apps gives students, parents and staff links to the college website, "Korero", latest news, the college calendar, the daily notices, the college Facebook pages, the parent portal and staff contact details. Once you have downloaded the app you will be able to subscribe to various sport and cultural groups so you can receive alerts. Alerts might inform you of changes of times for games or rehearsals or they might be whole school alerts such as civil defence warnings.
